**Consent Agenda**

Councilmember Jackson made a motion to move the bills off of the consent agenda for further discussion to item 4.a. All voted aye.

A motion was then made to accept the minutes of June 14<sup>th</sup>, June 15<sup>th</sup> and June 23<sup>rd</sup>. All voted aye.

**Bills for approval**

Council member Jackson questioned a bill from City Attorney Snook for \$120.00. A local business had called him when a question arose concerning soliciting within the city boundaries. Fred then called the Mayor and the Mayor had the City Clerk forward a copy of that section of the city code to the attorney. The City Attorney then looked up "soliciting" in the dictionary, determined that the business was soliciting, suggested that the Mayor add the discussion on the council agenda, then submitted a bill for an hours work in the amount of \$120.00 to the finance

department. Council member Jackson questioned whether the bill should have been paid by the city. After much discussion, a motion was made to accept the bills as submitted. All voted aye and the motion carried.

### **Application for Special Event – Calvary Chapel - Skate Your Fate**

The event is scheduled for July 16<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Skate Park. Council approved the application unanimously.

### **Consulting Agreement – William Gibbs**

Council unanimously approved the consulting agreement for the Island Park Bridge with William Gibbs with a change of June to July on line one.

### **Approve Tentative FY 2017 Budget**

Council approved the tentative FY 2017 Budget with a 5 aye vote. Council member Jackson voted no.

### **Street Name Proposal – Building Department**

Council voted unanimously to approve the Building Department's suggested name of Minnie Street for an access located off of South Challis Street. The name was picked because they felt it corresponded with other street names in that location.

### **Idaho Avenue Street Property Land Assessment**

Council will discuss this at the next regular meeting.

### **Soliciting Within City Boundaries**

It was determined that soliciting is not allowed and the only ones excluded are fundraisers for non-profit organizations for area youth.
