Decisions/Action Items

- 1) Council approved a payment center installation with no access to staff and Mayor offices without an appointment.
- 2) Council approved using the Covid-19 funds for purchase and installation of an internet video camera system to view the public and a digital recorder. Also purchase of a controlled access system.
- 3) Council approved all outside activities with no restroom facilities provided “following the Governor’s guidelines”.
- 4) Council voted to leave the budget as presented and corrected.

PAYMENT CENTER INSTALLATION

Due to Corona Virus concerns city employees have been trying to find a safe way to serve customers at City Hall. Scott Benton researched an indoor transaction station. It would be located inside the main front doors for those wishing to pay their bills inside at City Hall. Office doors will remain locked and appointments will be required for those meeting with the Mayor, Clerk, Utility Clerk or Finance Director. Councilor Bockelman made a motion to purchase and install the station using Covid-19 funds provided by the State of Idaho up to \$20,000. The motion was amended to have the order expedited.
